

Other golf courses around La Manga

Campoamor

The 18 holes at Campoamor are laid out in two connected valleys, surrounded by hills that protect them from the wind. The round is varied, and the fairway shots can be tricky with some greens on high ground and protected by bunkers. Campoamor was opened in 1989 and is one of the most panoramic courses in the region. The expansive fairways, excellent greens and the lakes make this a long and testing course with six “dog legs” to test you.

Hacienda del Alamo

This new par 72 course is 7,400 yards, one of the longest layout's in Spain. It is designed by Dave Thomas with eight lakes and 84 bunkers and provides a challenge for any standard of golfer. Their tour professional is Miguel Angel Jimenez – world number 20.

La Finca

This is a new course, opened in 2002, and set in the heart of the Vega Baja countryside, about 30 minutes' drive from La Manga Club, which has already received favourable reviews from those that have played the par 72 course. La Finca has been designed as a unique and challenging golf experience with breathtaking views.

Las Ramblas

A spectacular and challenging course designed by Jose Grancedo. Las Ramblas, meaning old riverbeds, provides elevated tee positions, narrow fairways between numerous pine trees and ravines that call for accuracy on each hole.

Mar Menor

Only 9 holes open at present, this David Thomas course is slightly inland and is built within a new complex of Polaris World. There are plenty of water hazards, 2 par 3, 5 par 4 and 2 par 5 holes at present, this promises to be another fine course.

Villamartin

Designed by John Putman and opened in 1972, the course is extremely varied over the 18 holes, and hosted the 1994 Mediterranean Open. Its magnificent greens are very fast and superbly kept, and usually hidden behind well-placed bunkers.

All courses are approximately 25 – 30 minutes from La Manga Club.
